This Day in History



On March 16th, 1964 The pop band, the Beatles, released their hit album Can't Buy Me Love. It proved to be a record-breaker, with 2.1 million advanced orders placed around the world. It broke the singles record set by Elvis Presley on Billboards Hot 100 Chart: Elvis Presley had nine hits on the list in 1956, while the Beatles had fourteen in 1964. The band became the first ever to hold all five top spots on the Billboards Hot 100 Chart and the single, Can't Buy Me Love, took top position.
